## Battle of Jutland

The battle of Jutland was the largest and most fierce sea battle fought in world war I. It took place on the Jutland bank about fifty miles off the coast of Denmark. It was fought between the British Royal Navy's Grand Fleet and the German Navy's High Sea Fleet. Most of the battle took place over a four hour period on the 31st May 1916. Over 100,000 sailors in 250 ships fought the battle. The final casualty list was 6017 British soldiers dead and 610 injured. 2,550 German soldiers dead 507 injured. At least 13 of the British navy sailors were from Cork. Six of those men were from Barryroe.

When Courmacsherry and Barryroe History group compiled the list of service men from the parish of Barryroe who died in service during world war one, Daniel O'Sullivan from Ballinlough was the only one of the twenty nine men killed while serving with American forces. Daniel O'Sullivan was born on January 1st 1894 son of William and Mary nee Kirby Ballinlough Ballyclare town.

He had six siblings Willie, Margaret, Julia, Patrick and John. Rather unusually for a large family Daniel was ~~the~~ only one to emigrate. It has not been possible to identify Daniel on passenger list of Irish migrants to the US but it is likely to have occurred after he reached the age of sixteen in 1909.

Daniel O'Sullivan's body was transported to West Cork and into the charge of Julia O'Sullivan Ballinlough Ballyclare town. He was reburied in Lislee cemetery on June 1st 1922.
