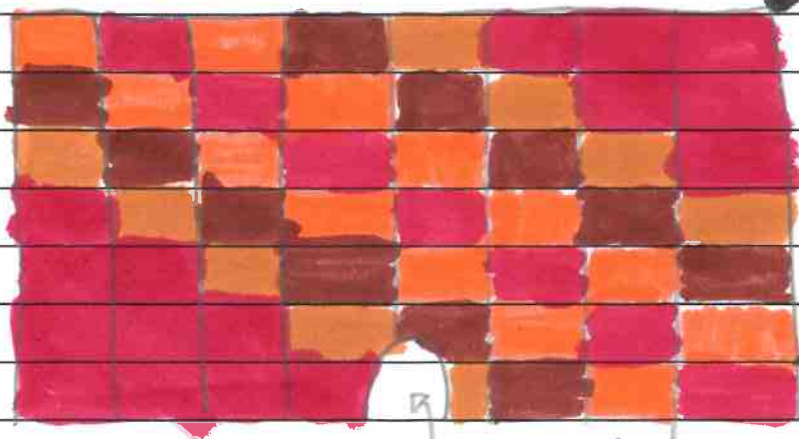
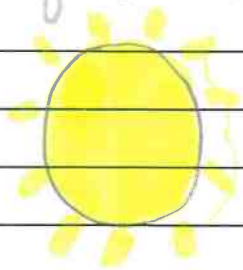

All companies of the volunteers had arm dumps in their area. One of these dumps was in Mr. Con Callaghan land. A pipe about a foot in diameter was placed in a fence and the end was covered with stones. This was six foot long and is capable of holding ten or twelve guns!

Families were split as they picked sides and who to be with. There would have been ambushes on houses and on bussiness's. People hid guns in places such as a pipe in a stone wall that was in a field. People were told to bury any valuables so the British forces could not take any of the.
