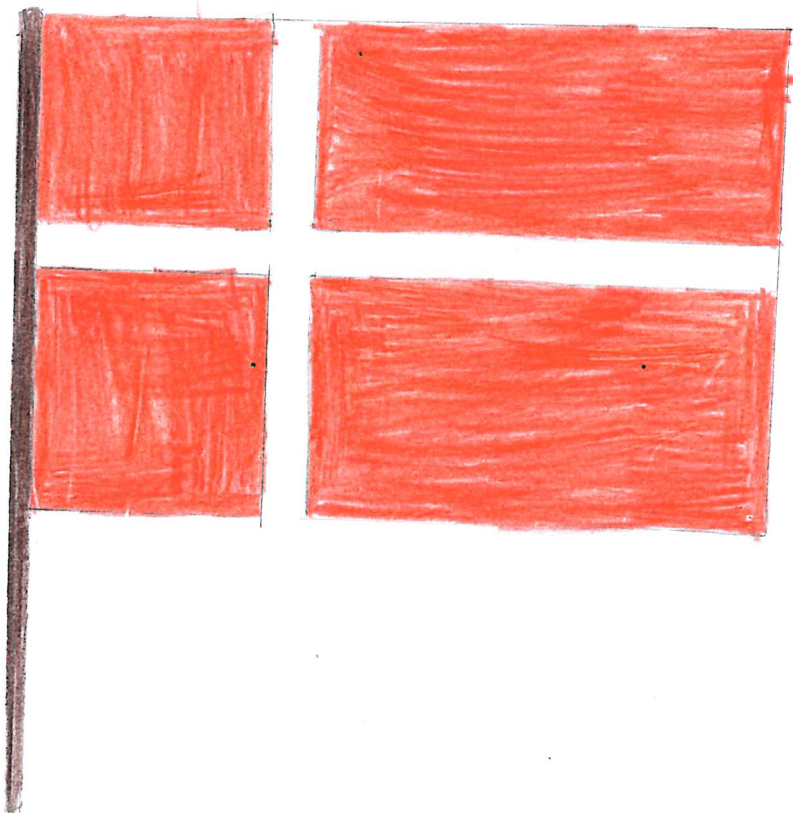
Kilmichael Ambush

Michael O Driscoll's health deteriorated, from being on the run and he went to Switzerland to recover from a bad case of contracted consumption.

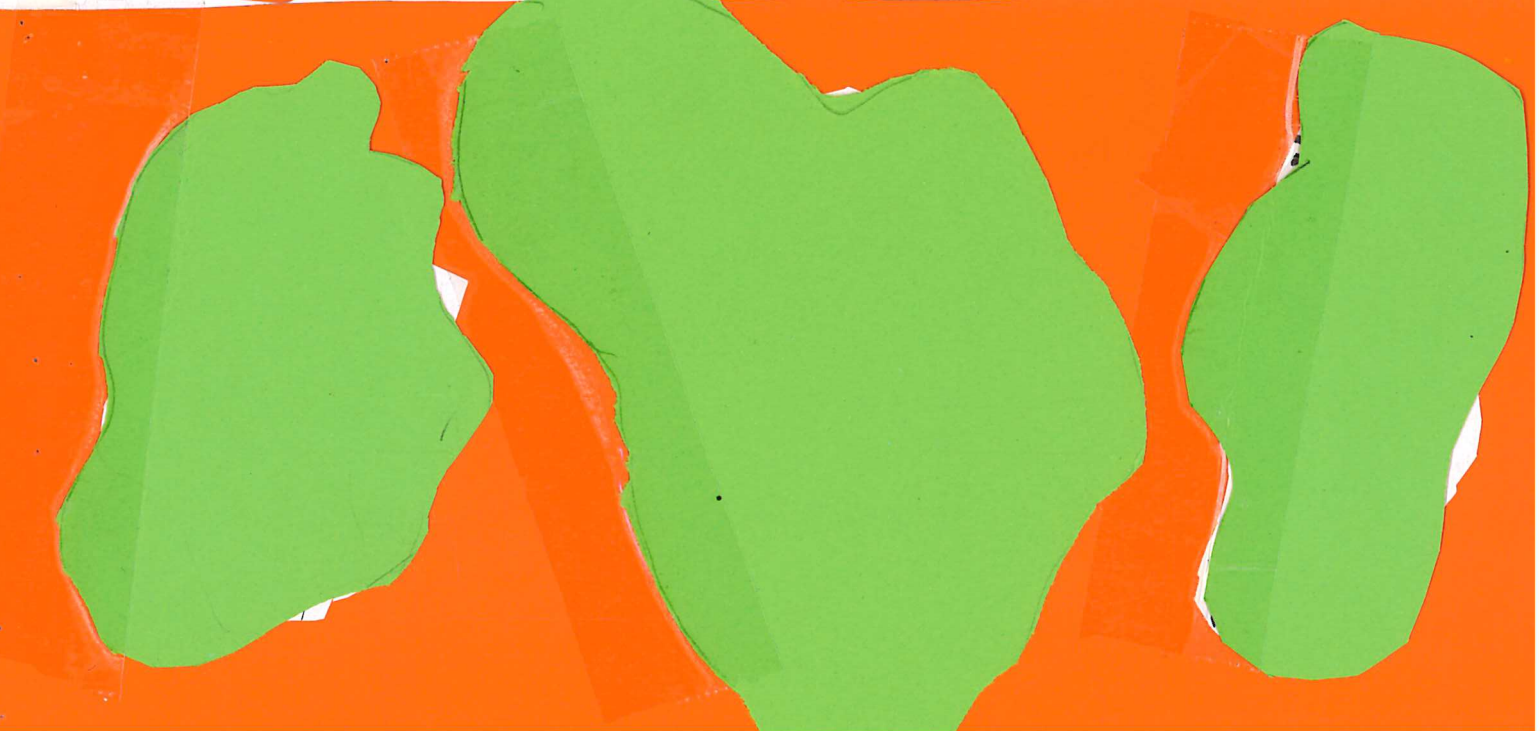


Later Life
