

James Clarence Buttiner was born in Dunmanway. He was in the Canadian armed forces and died in World War I as well as his cousin. James was killed on the 10th November, 1 day before the end of the war. His two brothers survived and came home.

His father James Buttiner was born in Derravree (Clonsilla) and he moved to Dunmanway and became a shopkeeper.

He was born in 1840 (20th December) and was shot on the 27th April 1922. He was shot in "Dunmanway Killings" aged 82. He was not meant to be shot. He was shot by accident.

The killings were never authorised because the dead men were signing a treaty in Dublin. There was supposed to be a truce and no shootings. The men who they thought were informers.
