During the Civil war, local Republican, Charles Dullea was on the wanted list of the Free State soldiers. At a threshing in McLaughys of Co. Donegal in Autumn of 1922, Dullea was helping to make the straw-rick when the free state soldiers appeared in search of him. Dullea was covered with straw by his friends and when one of the soldiers went up on the rick demanding to know his whereabouts, they replied that they had not seen him. At this the soldier fired a bullet from his rifle into the straw near the spot Dullea was hiding. The soldiers then left and after a long dramatic pause the tension was relieved when Dullea emerged from the straw, holding in his hand was his hat, which had received two bullet holes from the bullet that just narrowly missed.
