

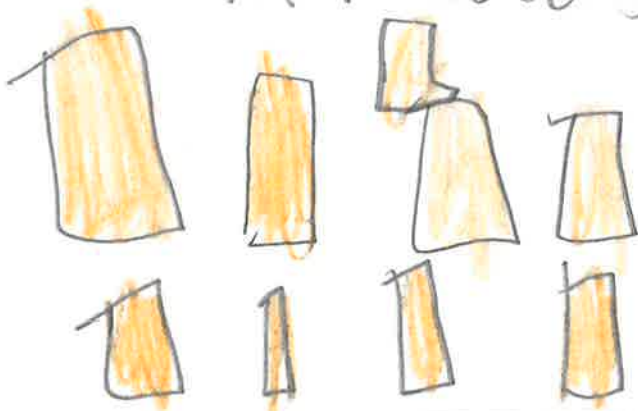
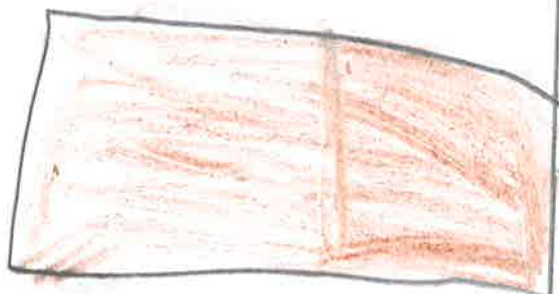

Life was very tough for farmers back in those days. They had no milking machines so they had to milk by hand.

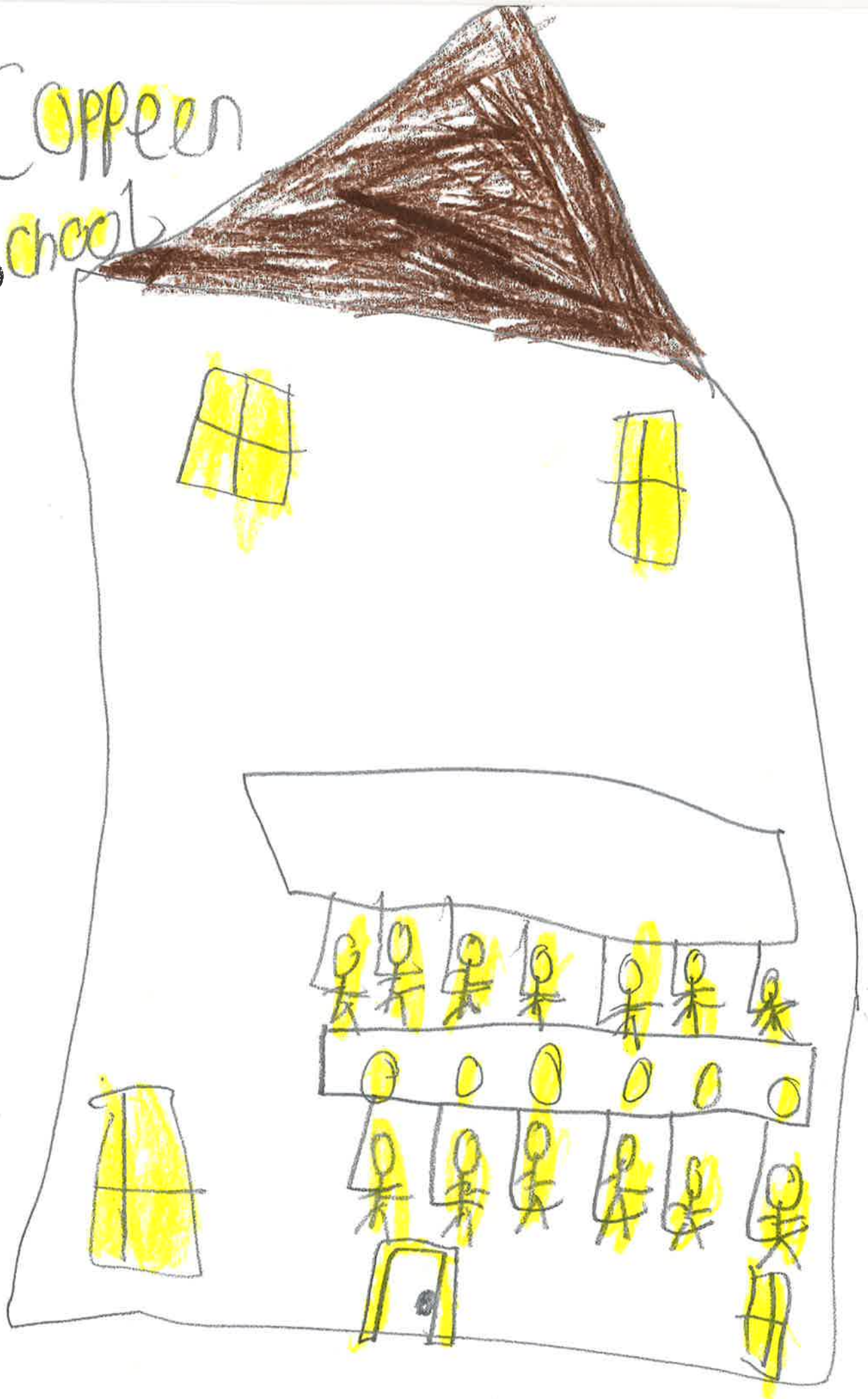
