Sean Hayes

Sean Hayes was a member of Sinn Féin. He was an editor of the cork county southern star of skibbereen. He was elected for west cork at the 1918 general election. He became a member of the pro treaty fraction of Sinn Féin before 1922 general election. He was arrested by the British forces during a raid in Dublin in November 1918. Sean Hayes also welcomed Eamon De Valera when he came to skibbereen in 1918 as part of a visit to west cork town.

Sean (John) Hayes represented Cork Mid, South, Southeast and West Dail Eireann Constituency.

He was elected in the Irish ~~goverat~~ general election of 1918.

In the 1918 election, the Sinn Fein party won most of the Irish seats in the British Parliament in Westminster London.

Sean known as John did not take up his seat in the British Parliament. John Hayes as a member of Sinn Fein formed a parliament instead in Dublin.

The first meeting of this parliament took place in January 1919.
