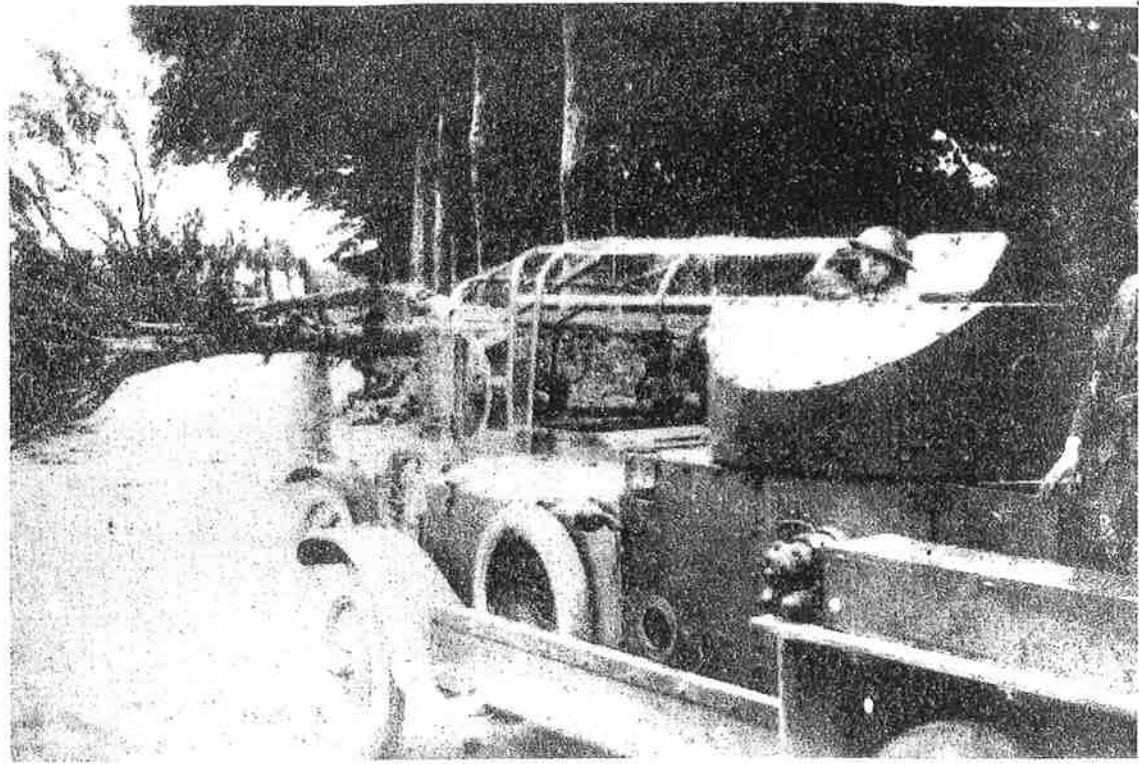

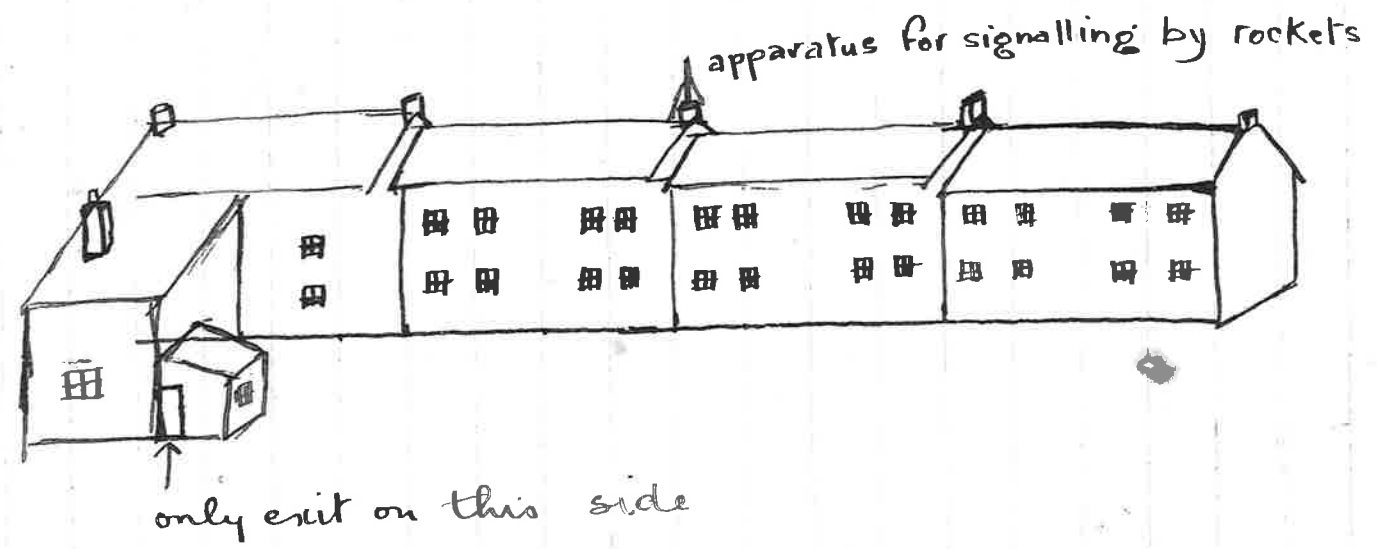

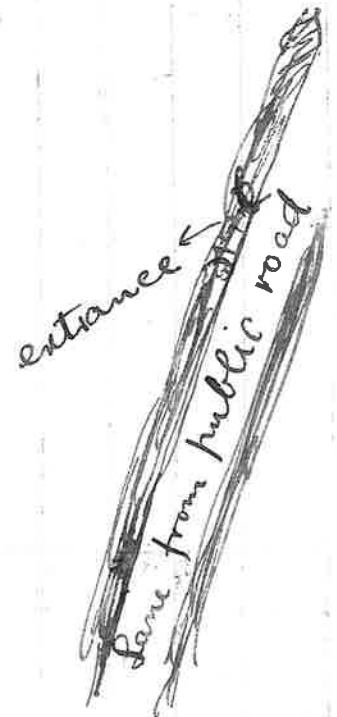
An incident at the Beech Hedge on

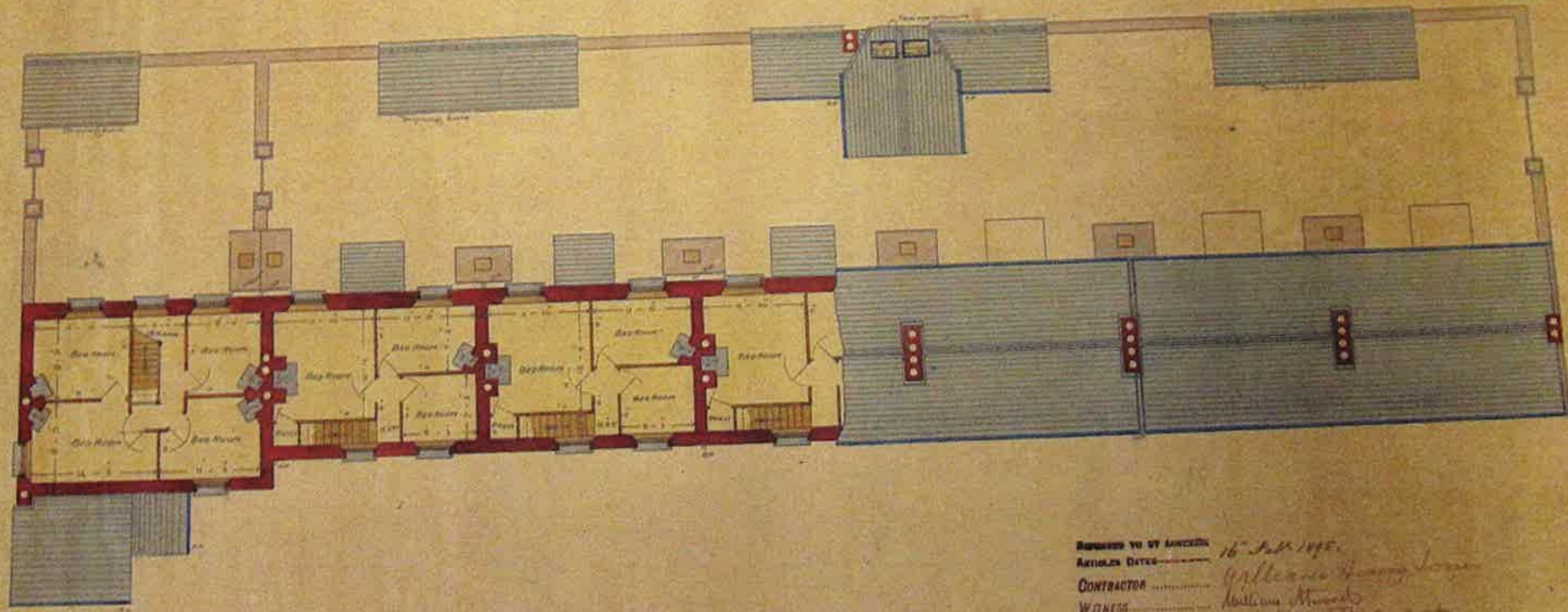
