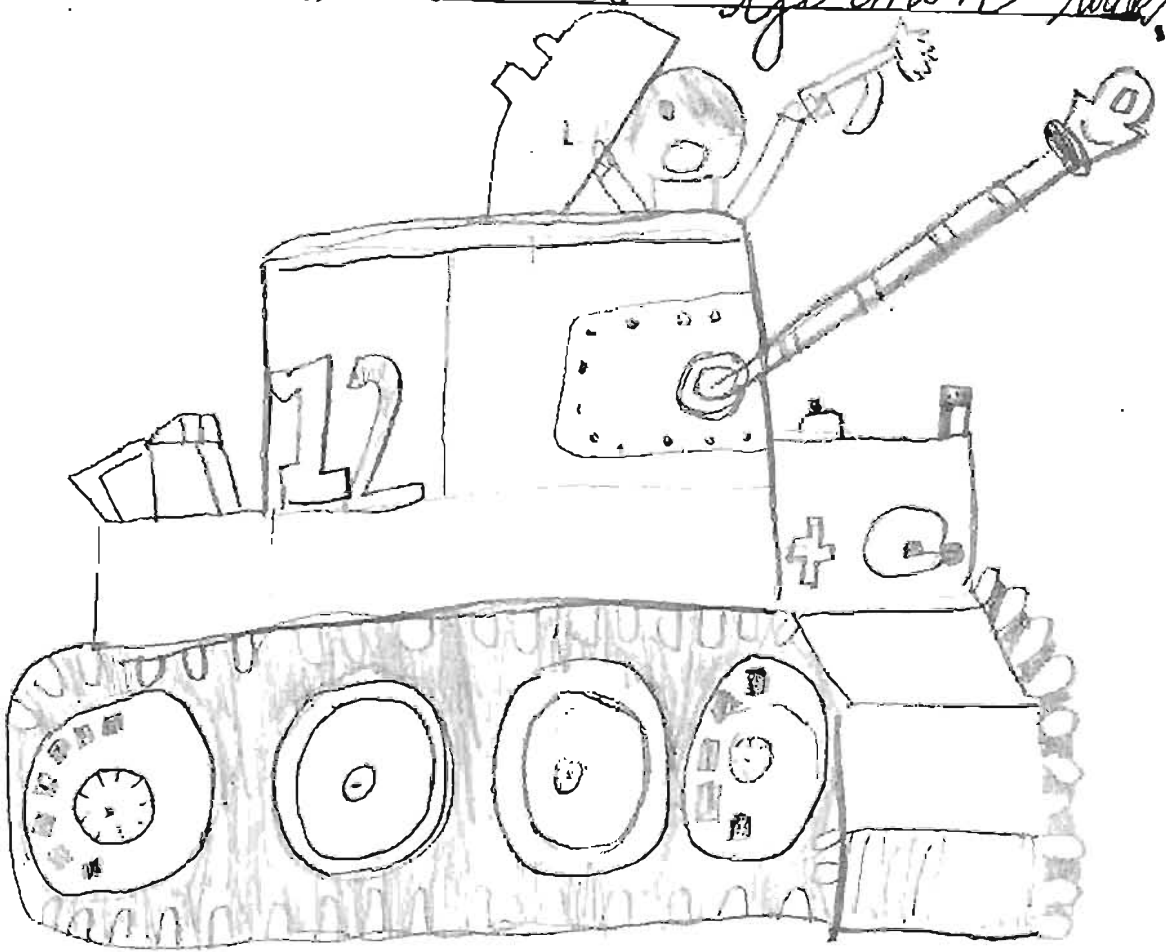


DUTCH HISTORY
